Duties will include:

- Create and lead innovative and effective international agriculture programs in cooperation with any and all units of Texas A&M Agriculture, including extension offices, research and extension center personnel, affiliated universities, departments and other units of benefit to Texas, the U.S. and other countries.
- Supervise and conduct successful proposal and project development responding to the terms of reference issued by international development/donor agencies, so as to attract external funding to support the Institute's mission.

The ideal candidate would have the ability to qualify for appointment as a tenured or tenured-track faculty member in a department of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences and perform requested responsibilities by the department such as classroom instruction, student thesis research supervision, leadership of study abroad, and/or other academic roles as requested.

- Ph.D. or equivalent degree in a field of high relevance to international agriculture development.
- Qualification in foreign language(s) and/or foreign area studies.
- At least 2 years working experience while in residence in a developing country.
- Administrative experience in international agricultural research, extension, academic programming or development assistance, i.e. Peace Corps, CGIAR (Consultative Group on International Agricultural Research), or other international body.
- Superior writing and public speaking ability.
- Reading, writing, and speaking ability in at least one language in addition to English.
- Proven ability to create productive working relationships in cross-cultural environments.
- Ability to travel frequently for periods of up to 6 weeks to other countries, including areas designated developing countries, with inconvenient living conditions.
- Interest and ability to take students on study abroad programs.
- Record of superior performance in short-term consulting in agriculture development.
