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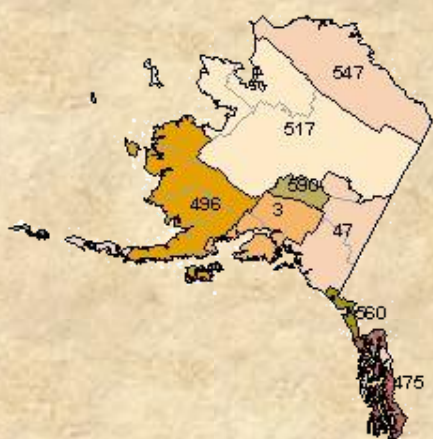
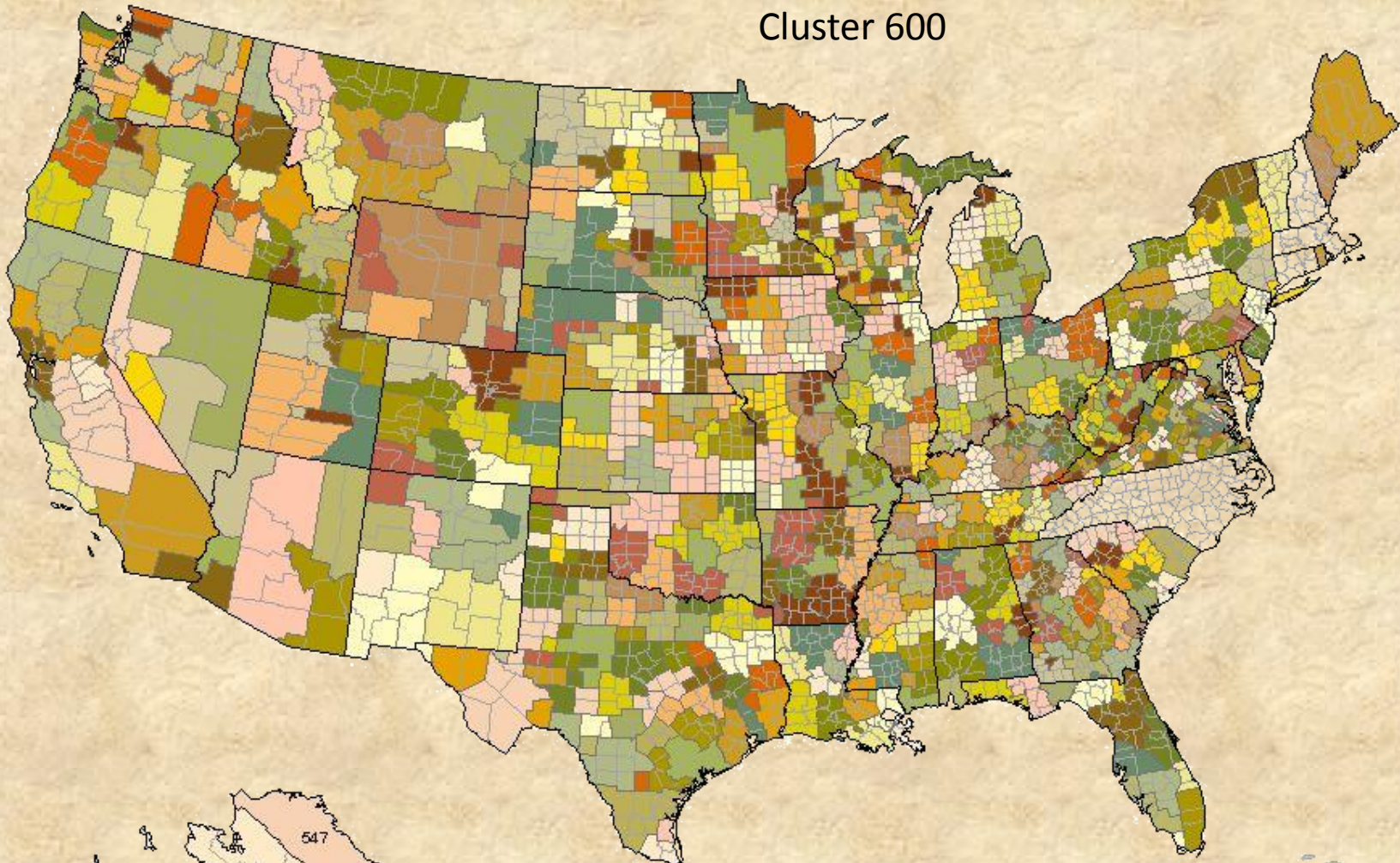
Summary

- Based on county level commuting data from U.S. Census Bureau Local Employment Dynamics Project (LED)
- LED is a cooperative relationship between Census Bureau and States
- Not all states participate; hence we have only 46 states from which regions can be calculated

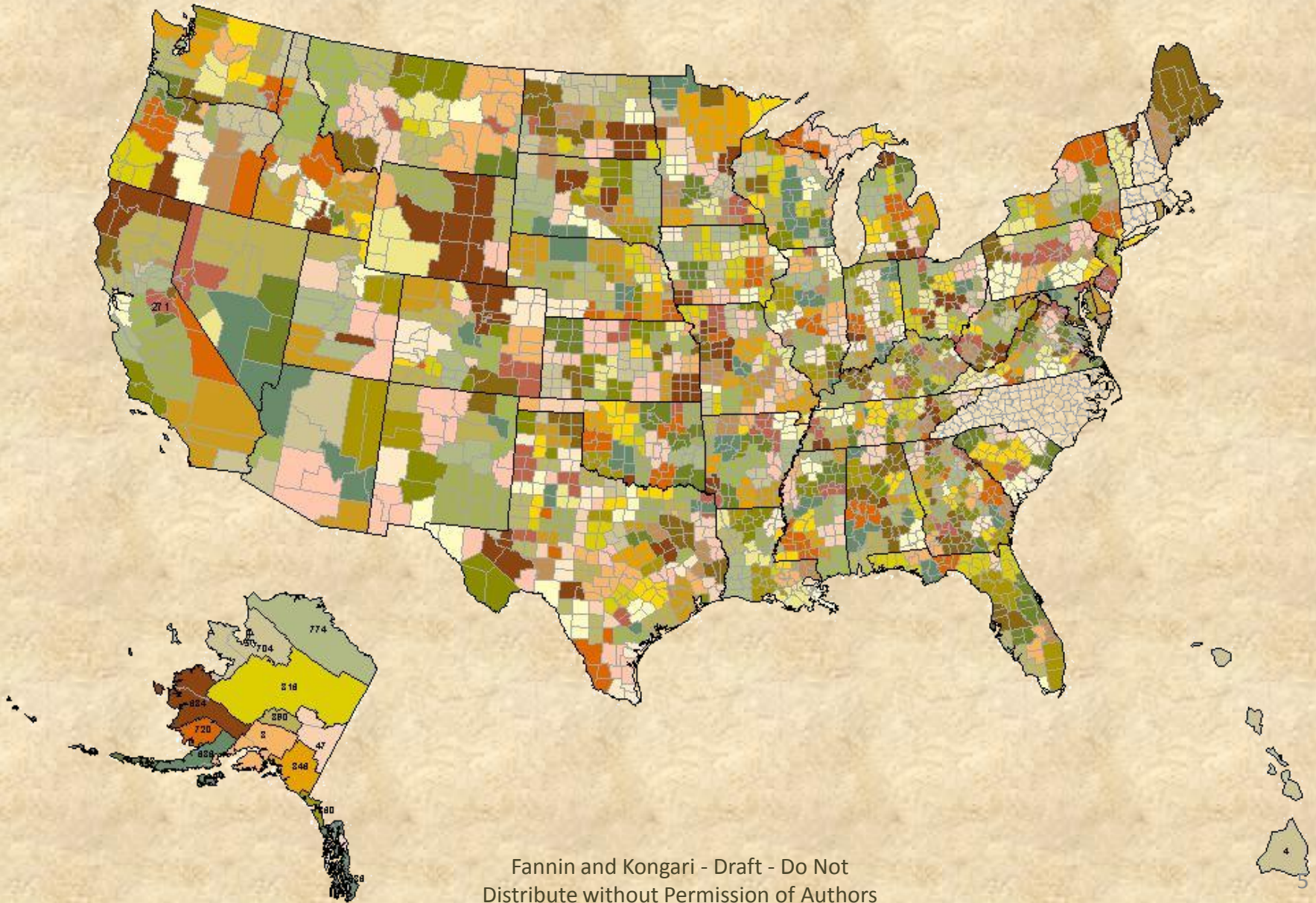
Summary

- We generated from the original 3,000 remaining counties for the 46 states analyzed to cluster maps of 300, 600, 900, and 1,200 regions representing approximately 0.1, 0.2, 0.3 and 0.4 of the original 3,000 counties
- American territories are currently not a part of the LED project
