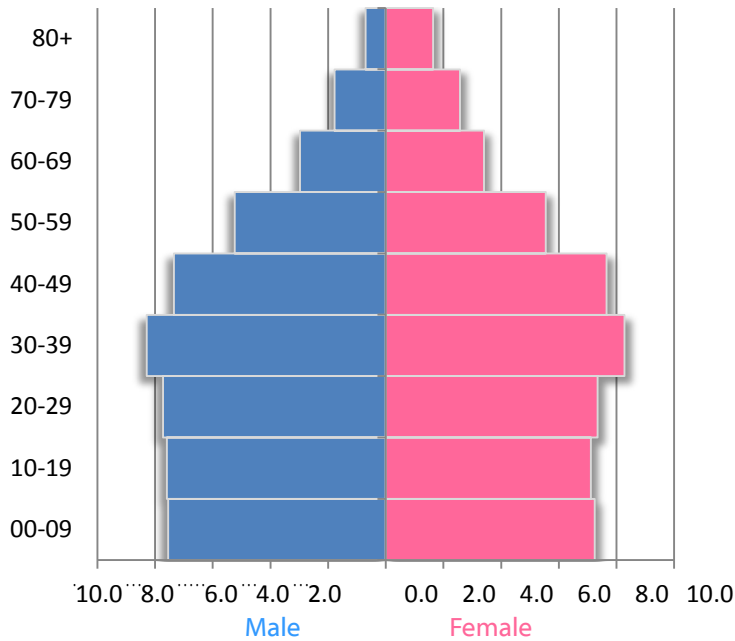


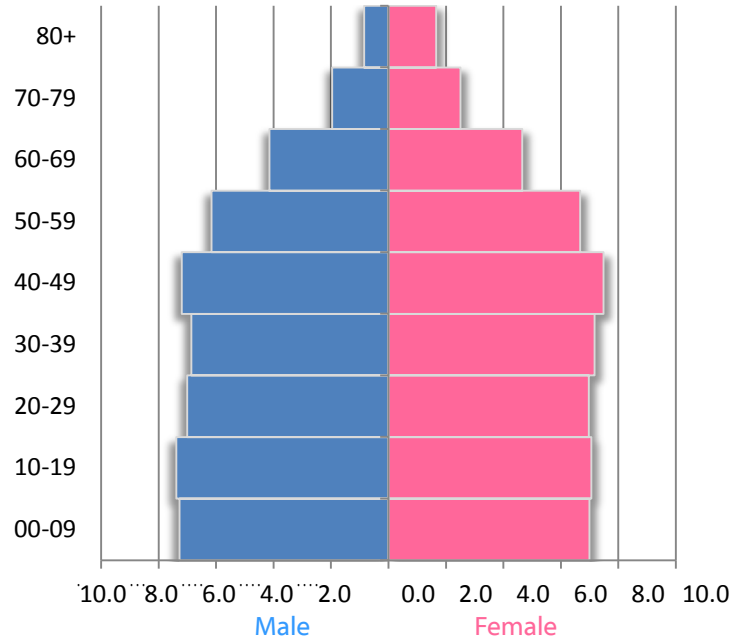

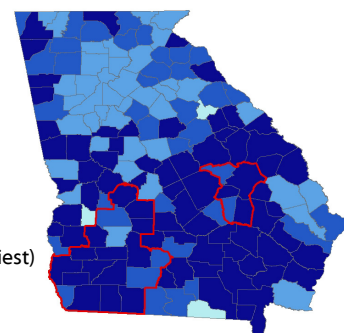

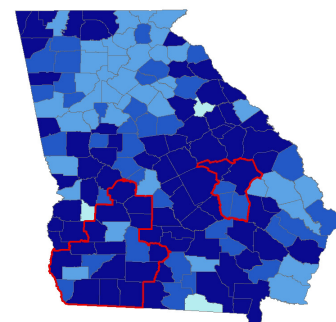

MORTALITY (Premature Death)



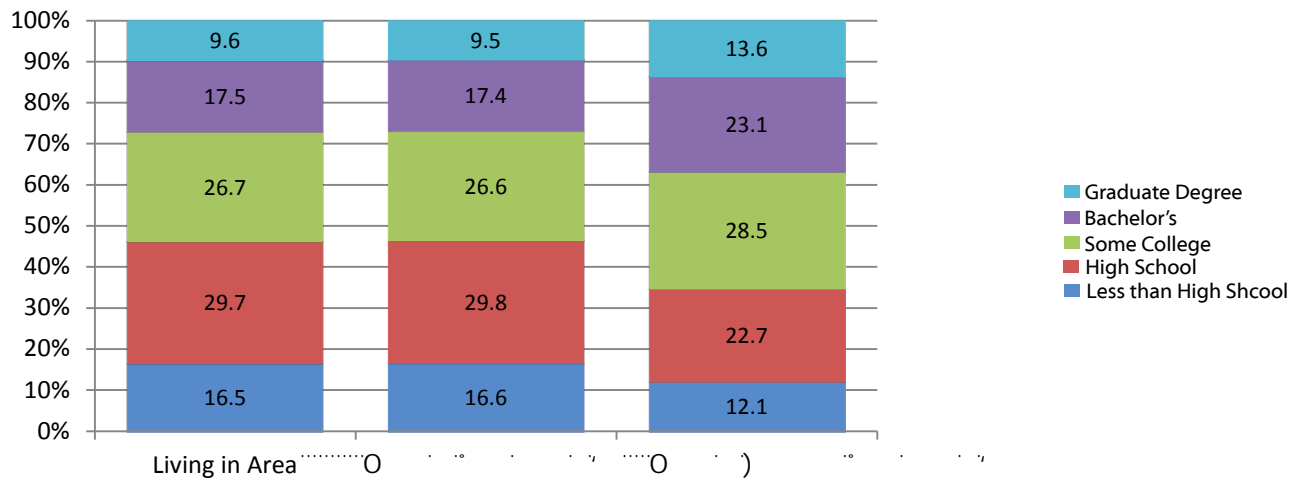
MORBIDITY

GEOGRAPHICAL MOBILITY (Over past year)



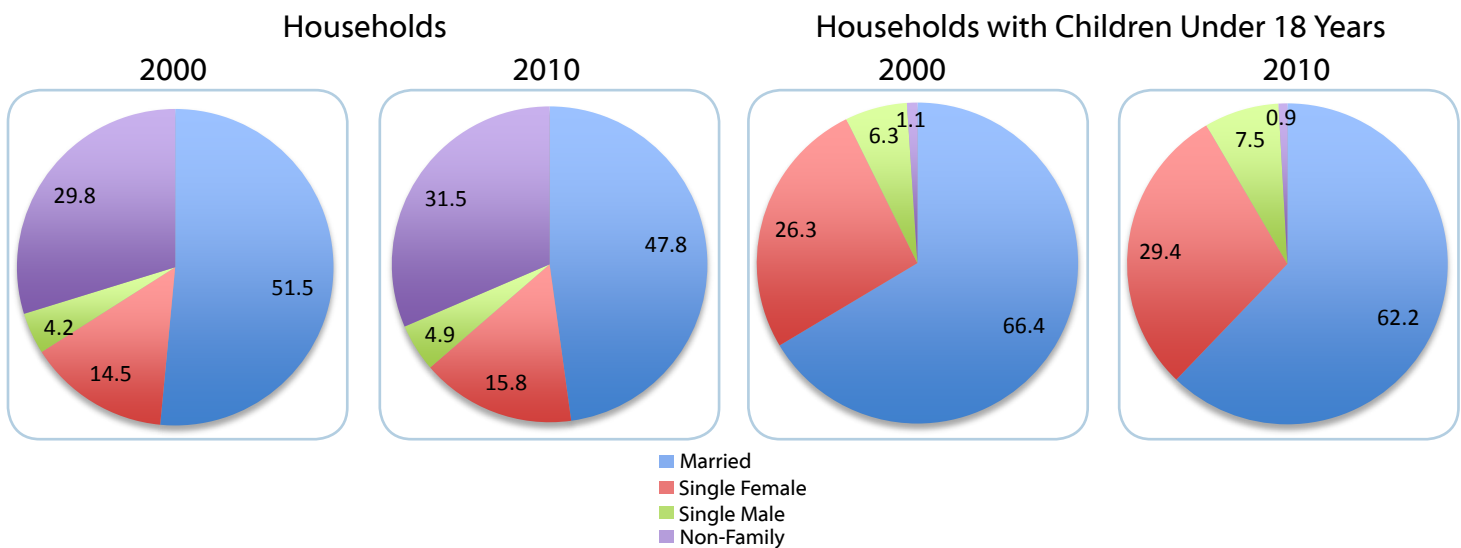
