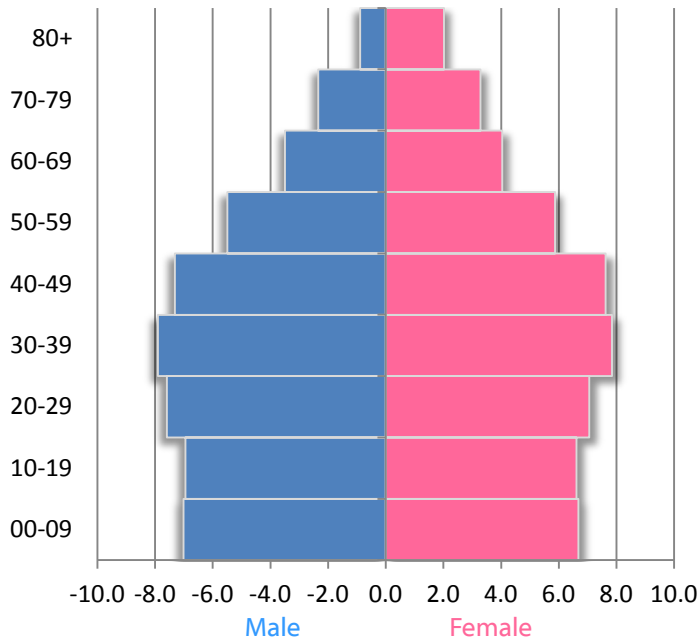


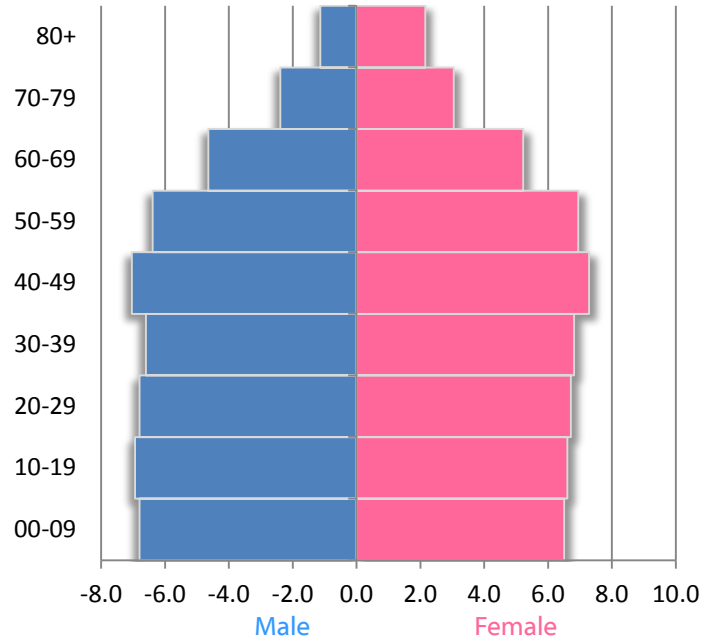

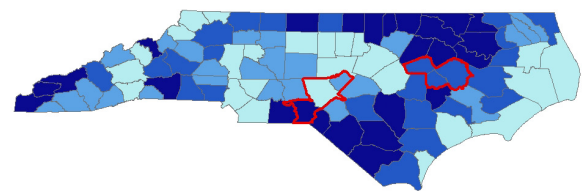

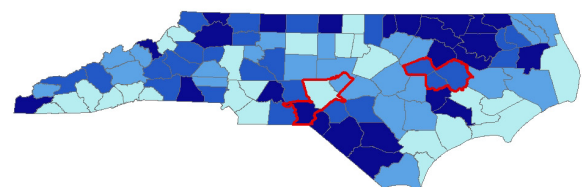

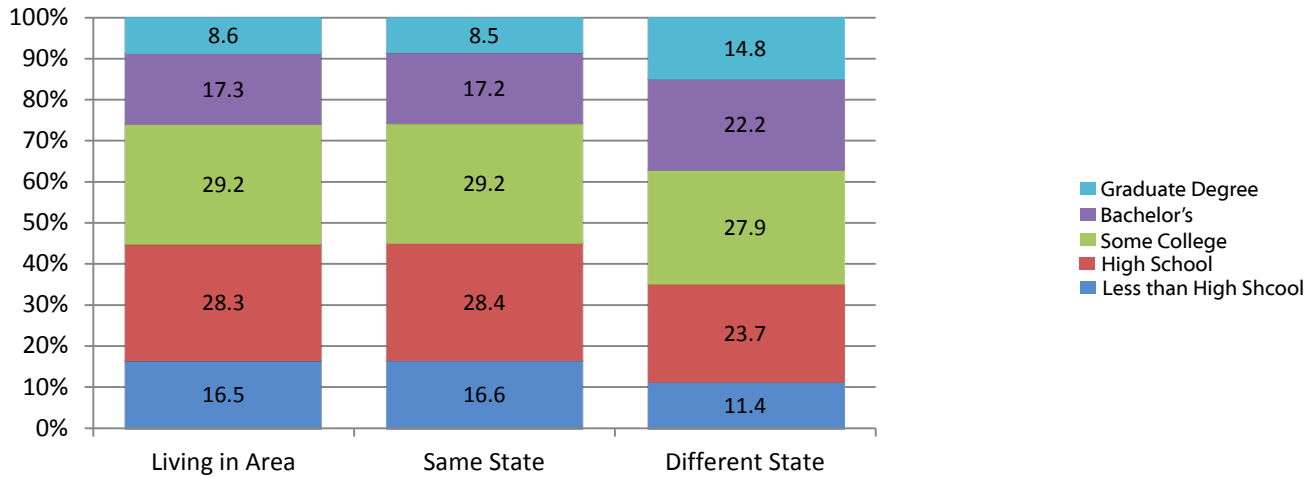
### MORBIDITY

## GEOGRAPHICAL MOBILITY (Over past year)



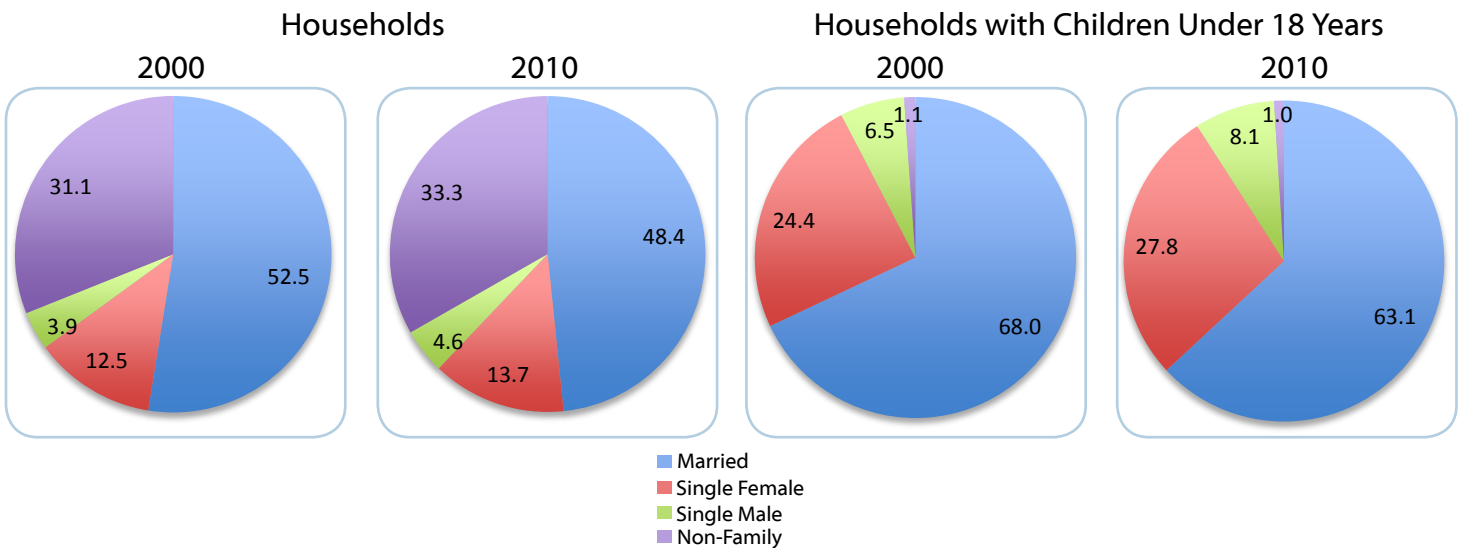
