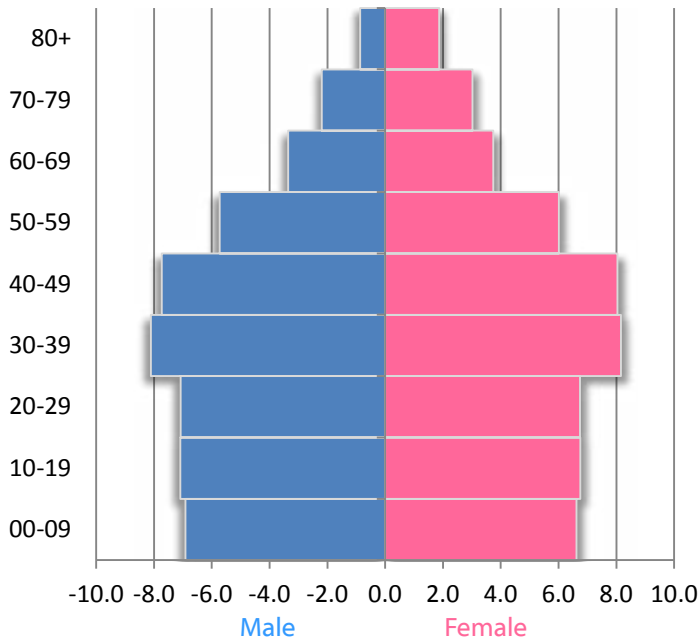

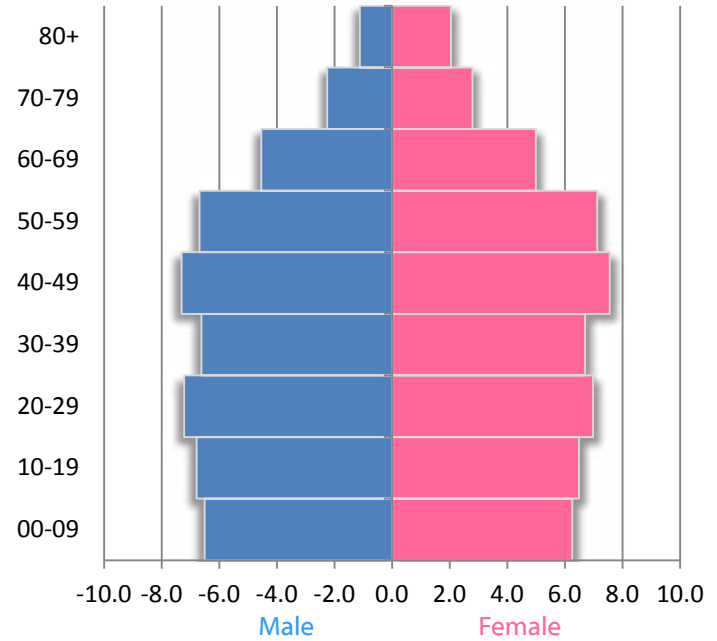

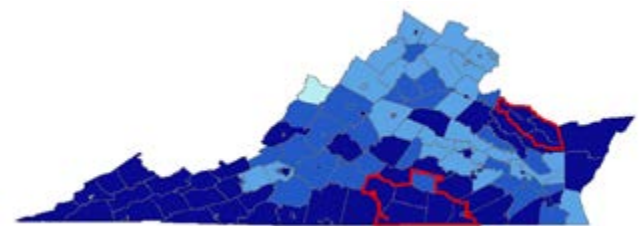

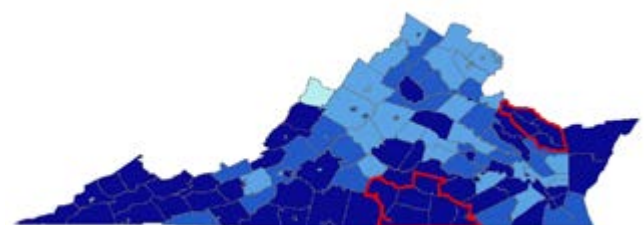

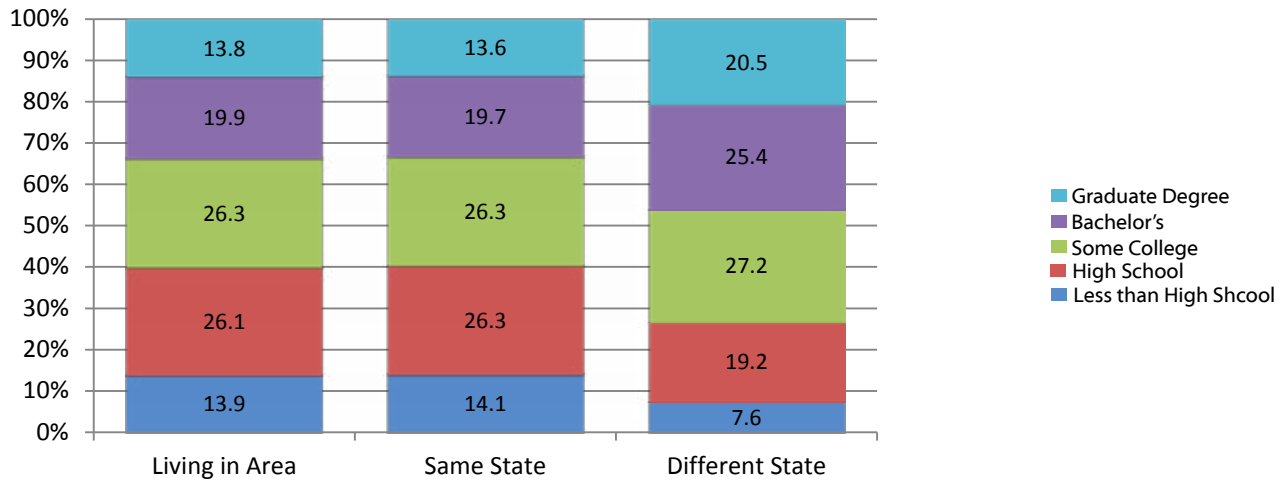
MORBIDITY

GEOGRAPHICAL MOBILITY (Over past year)



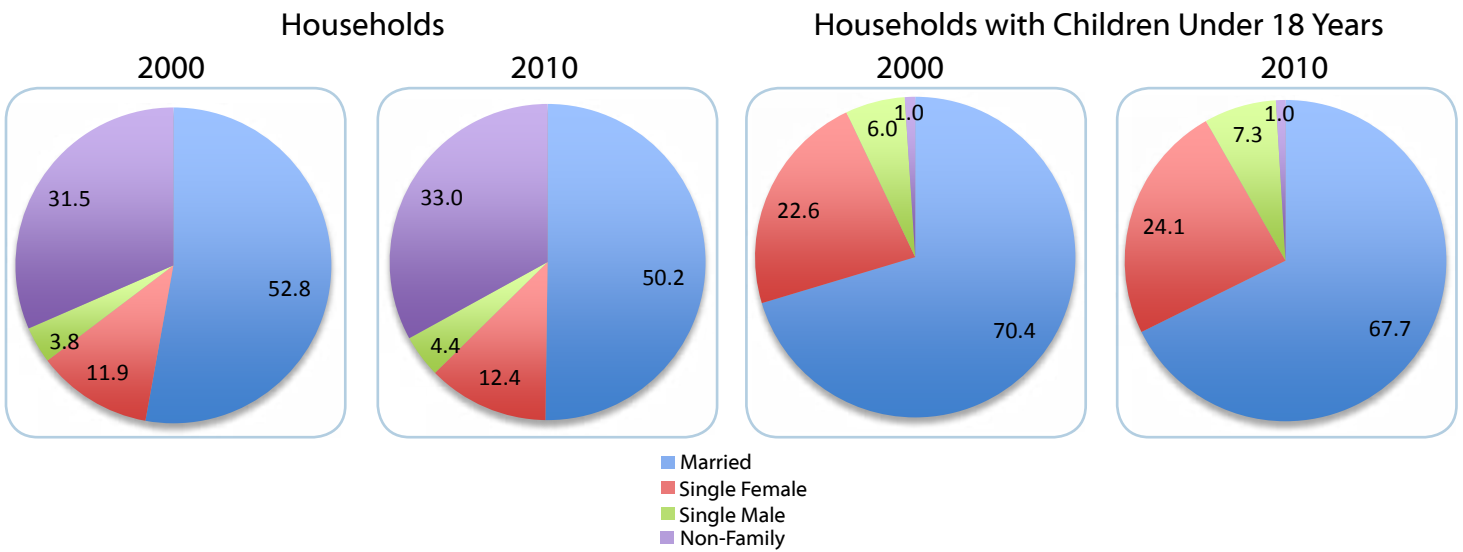
