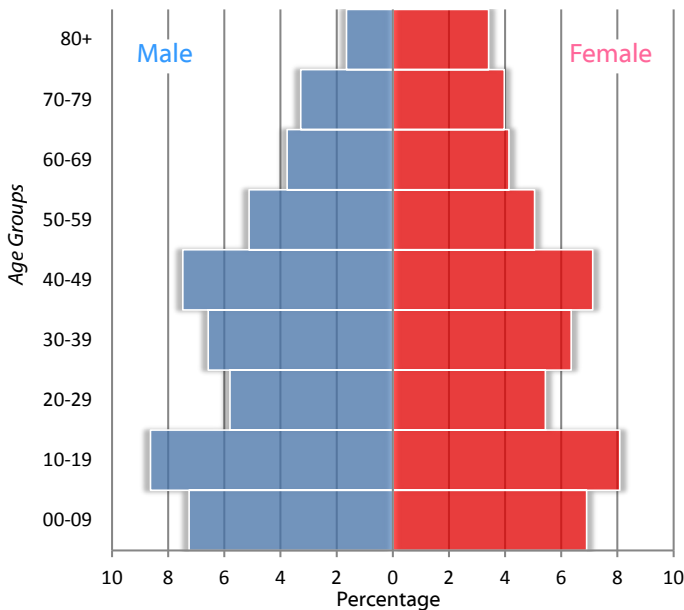

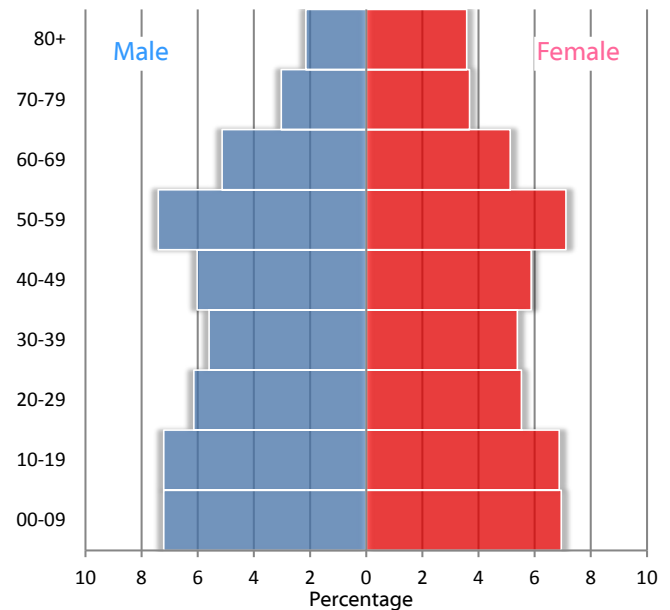

### MORBIDITY (How Healthy People Feel)

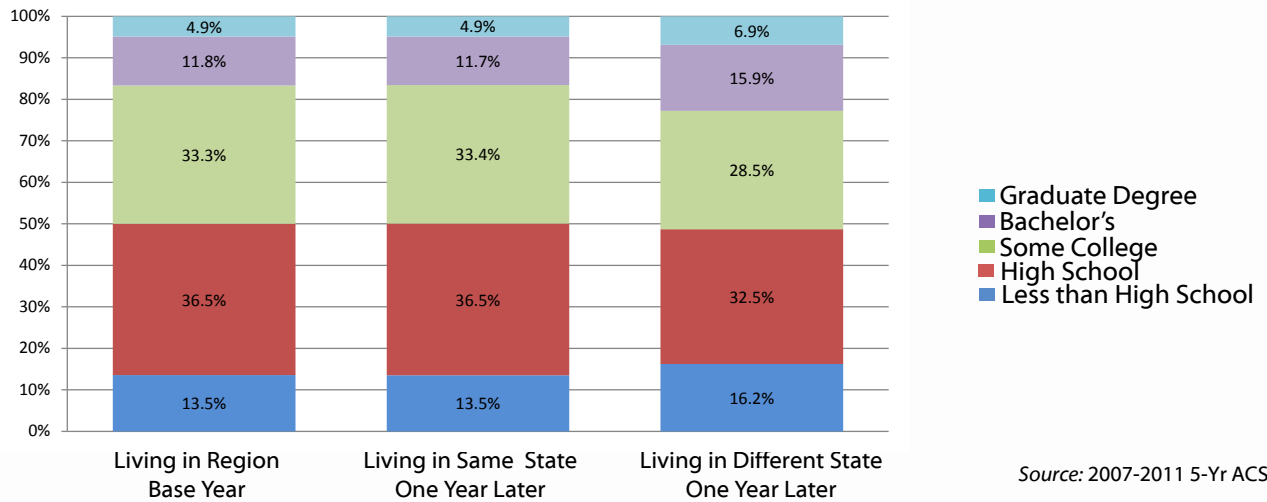

## GEOGRAPHICAL MOBILITY (Over Past Year)



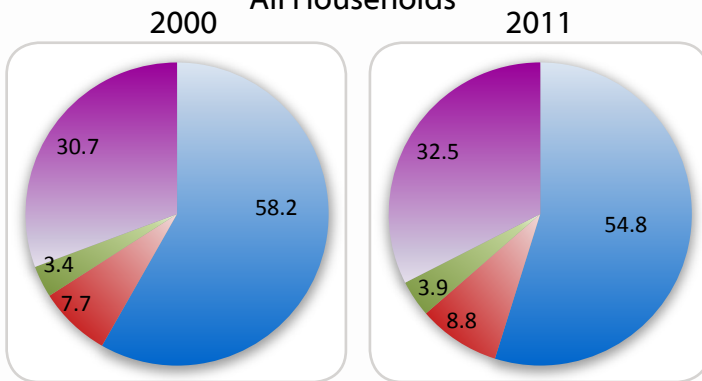
