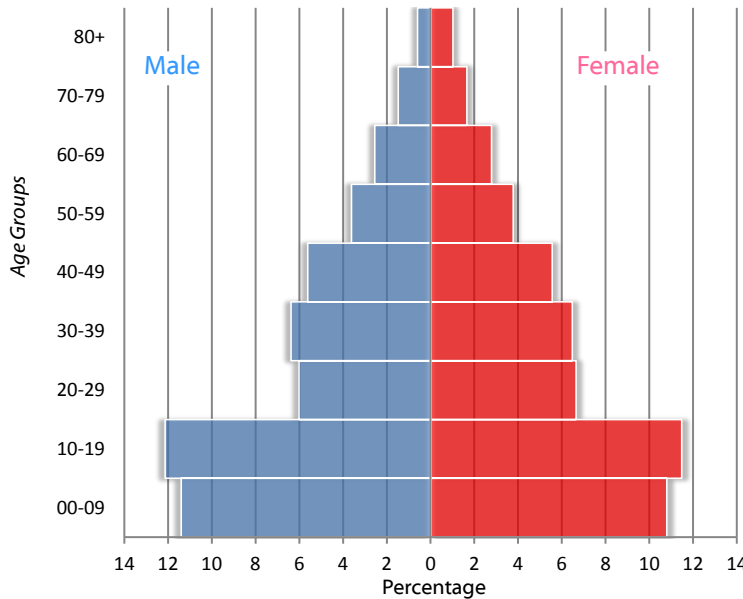

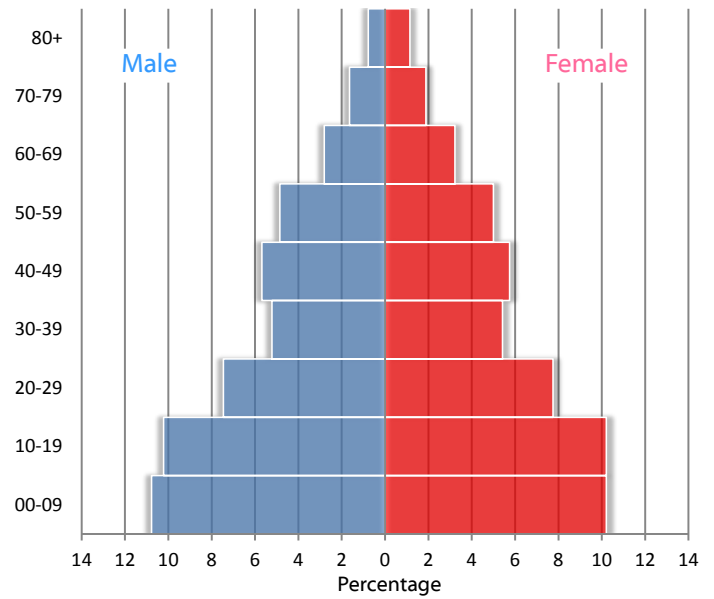

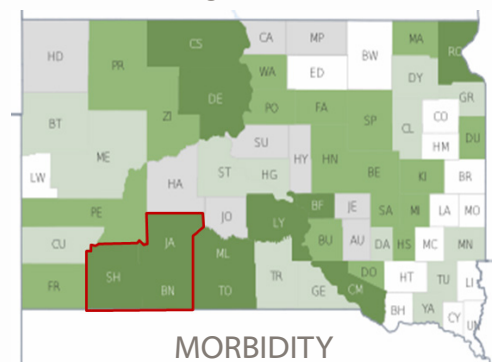

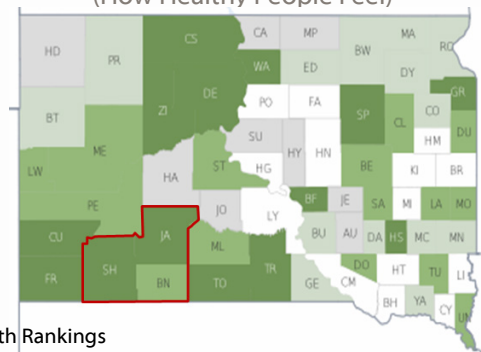

MORBIDITY (How Healthy People Feel)

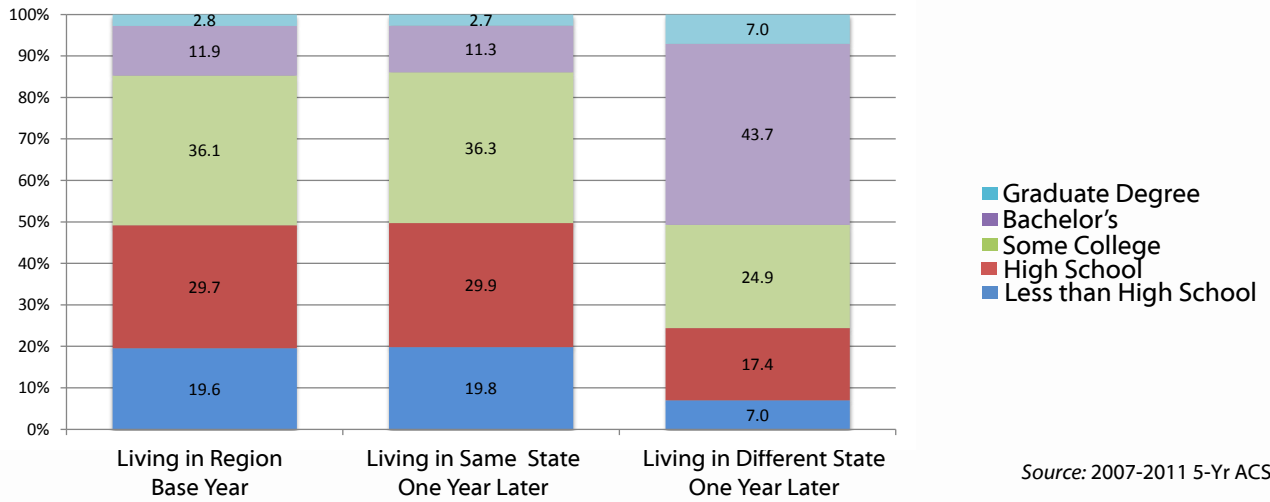

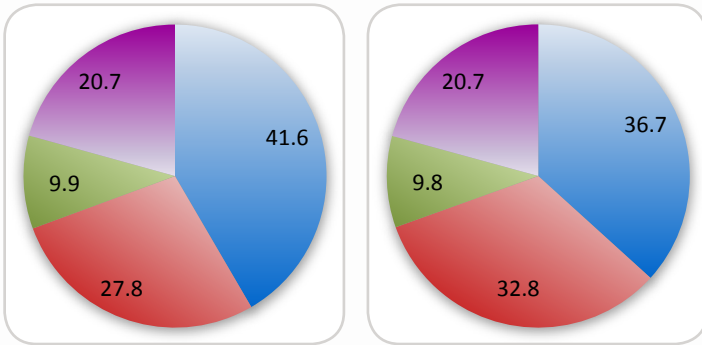
