ReOpen downtown Frankfort Grant Money Awarded to 18 Small Businesses

Frankfort, KY -- REOPEN Downtown Frankfort grant program partners the Frankfort Area Chamber of Commerce and Frankfort First Foundation announced today that more than \$82,000 has been invested in downtown Frankfort's small businesses.

Less than two -weeks after the closing date of the grant application for the REOPEN Downtown Frankfort grant program, award checks were distributed to 18 local small business owners. The Frankfort Area Chamber and Frankfort First Foundation are proud to showcase these businesses to our local community.

"This is a significant investment in our small businesses who were forced to alter how they do business and close their doors to customers during COVID-19. Our Frankfort First Foundation Board members were so glad to be able to offer the grants to businesses and help reduce some of their stress of paying rent, utilities, and payroll during this time said Carmen Inman, President/CEO, of the Frankfort Area Chamber of Commerce.

The grant program issued individual awards between \$1,500 and \$4,700 to downtown Frankfort businesses as a form of gap funding. Of the small businesses receiving grant funding, 22.2.% are minority-owned and 55.6% are woman-owned. The awards are intended to cover operational expenses and help businesses keep their doors open and lights on until their revenue sources recover.

The CareSource Foundation kick-started the REOPEN downtown Frankfort Grant program with a generous donation of \$90,000 to the fund. Also, after the grant program was introduced our local businesses have been making donations for a Phase 2 grant program later in 2020. Donations are still be accepted for the Phase 2 Grant.

"Collaboration is a key part of how CareSource engages in the community," said Dan McCabe, CEO of the CareSource Foundation. "So to see this come together so quickly and people doing the right thing, all focused on supporting our local businesses, it just speaks volumes to the partnerships we've been able to foster in Frankfort."

An executive committee made up of Frankfort business and community leaders reviewed applications and made all decisions for the dispersal of grant funding.
