Listening Session Voluntary Opportunity on Rural Population Change



The <u>Rural Population Research Network (RPRN)</u> is leading an effort to identify the issues diverse rural stakeholders see as top priorities for understanding population change. They are inviting Extension colleagues working with rural people and places to participate in one hour online listening sessions on challenges and opportunities related to population change in any of the four following areas:

Agriculture and Food Systems (February 8 @ 11am ET/10am CT/9am MT/8am PT)

This session will focus on how population changes in rural America affect agricultural regulations, loss of farmland, farmland preservation, housing, value-added production, labor shortages, etc.

Community and Economic Development (February 15 @ 11am ET/10am CT/9am MT/, 8am PT)

This session will focus on how population changes in rural America affect local tax bases, development vs. gentrification, job opportunities, financing public services, recruiting employers, affordable housing, etc.

Environment and Natural Resources (February 22 @ 11am ET/10am CT/9am MT/8am PT)

This session will focus on how population changes in rural America affect delivery of water and/or sewer services, infrastructure costs and maintenance, environmental preservation, lack of capacity to maintain, protect, and/or provide clean and affordable water, etc.

Health, Health Care, and Disability Services (February 29 @ 11am ET/10am CT/9am MT/ 8am PT)

This session will focus on how population changes in rural America affect aging populations' health care services, opioid crisis management, access to and affordability of health care services, deficit of health workers, etc.

Please register for the session(s) most closely aligned with your areas of expertise and interest for sharing.

Your insights will be used to inform future research on these topics. Findings from the sessions will be used to produce a public report, presentations, and publications identifying topics of interest and priorities for future applied research. Findings will also help guide the work of the <u>Rural Population Research Network</u> and be shared with stakeholders including participants, state and federal agencies, and philanthropic organizations.

University of Arkansas Extension Launches EDA Center for Rural Resilience and Workforce Development

In October 2023, The University of Arkansas System Division of Agriculture Cooperative Extension Service (UADA-Extension) received a five-year, \$650,000 grant from the U.S. Economic Development Administration to create and support Extension's Center for Rural Resilience and Rural Development. Extension's EDA University Center extends our mission to strengthen Arkansans and their communities by connecting them with research-based resources throughout the state.

The Center is not a physical location. Rather, it is embedded within the Community, Professional, and Economic Development Unit and uplifts the strengths of the unit to support state's "economic development ecosystem," through the planning and development districts with a particular focus on rural marginalized, Hispanic, and

Marshallese communities. The economic development ecosystem includes the organizations and groups that focus on improving local economies as well as county extension offices.

The particular focus of the work is through Arkansas' eight Planning and Development Districts, or PDDs, which are funded by the U.S. Economic Development Administration. PDDs are multi-jurisdictional entities, commonly composed of multiple counties and sometimes across state borders. PDDs develop local and regional strategies for comprehensive economic development, and they partner with public, private, and non-profit sectors to implement these strategies.

Postdoctoral Fellow/Research Associate - Decision-Making & Team Science, Auburn University

The Department of Agricultural Economics and Rural Sociology at Auburn University is accepting applications for a postdoctoral fellowship. The anticipated start date is April 15, 2024, for an initial period of 24 months with a possibility of extension depending on the availability of funding. This is a benefit eligible, non-tenure track position. They seek an energetic and motivated postdoctoral fellow/research associate to conduct innovative socioeconomic research for a project titled, Socio-Agroclimatology: Farm Security, Equity, and Sustainability. The minimum qualifications include an earned Ph.D. in any of the following or closely allied fields at the time employment begins: agricultural economics, environmental economics, environmental studies, science, and technology studies, economic or cultural geography, sociology, or rural sociology. Prior research in agrifood systems studies, as well as the science of team science, transdisciplinary, and convergence is highly desired. Experience working with data in Excel is also desired.
