- 1. Address
  - a. the particulars of the place where someone lives or a business/organization is situated
  - b. unique computer host location on the Internet expressed either as a unique string of numbers or as its associated domain name
- 2. Application
  - a. a document that is completed when making a request (example job interview)
  - b. any program or group of programs that is designed for the end user including things such as database programs, word processors, web browsers, and spreadsheets
- 3. Attack
  - a. to take aggressive action with weapons or armed force
  - b. an information security threat that involves an attempt to obtain, alter, destroy, remove, implant or reveal information without authorized access or permission
- 4. Backbone
  - a. the series of vertebrae extending from the skull to the pelvis
  - b. part of computer network that interconnects various pieces of network, providing a path for the exchange of information between different subnetworks
- 5. Binary
  - a. relating to two things
  - b. a computer base-2 numbering system that uses the numerals 0 and 1 for counting
- 6. Bit
- a. a small quantity of something
- b. the smallest unit of data in a computer; short for binary digit
- 7. Block
  - a. a large solid piece of hard material, especially rock, stone, or wood, typically with flat surfaces on each side.
  - b. a contiguous set of bits or bytes that forms an identifiable unit of data
- 8. Bookmark
  - a. a strip of leather, cardboard, or other material used to mark one's place in a book
  - b. the saved address of a website or file to enable quick access in future.
- 9. Bugs
  - a. the slag terminology for insects
  - b. errors, flaws or failures in a computer program or system that causes it to produce an incorrect or unexpected result
- 10. Bump
  - a. a light blow or a jolting collision.
  - b. when someone posts in a thread and the thread moved to the top of a page
- 11. Canoe
  - a. a long, narrow boat that's typically paddled by two people without a motor
  - b. a Twitter conversation that has picked up too many usernames for an actual conversation to take place
- 12. Catfish
  - a. a freshwater or marine fish with barbels resembling whiskers around the mouth, typically bottomdwelling
  - b. a situation where a user is impersonating someone else online and/or in some digital interaction
- 13. Cloud
  - a. a visible mass of condensed water vapor floating in the atmosphere, typically high above the ground
  - b. storing and accessing data and programs over the Internet instead of your computer's hard drive

- 14. Cookie
  - a. a small sweet treat, typically round, flat, and crisp
  - b. small text file created by a website that is stored in the computer temporarily for that session

## 15. Desktop

- a. the working surface of a desk
- b. the working area of a computer screen containing icons representing items such as files

## 16. Dock

- a. a structure extending alongshore or out from the shore into a body of water, to which boats may be moored.
- b. the process of connecting your computer to a power station
- 17. Driver
  - a. person operating a motorized vehicle
  - b. a program that controls a device
- 18. Element
  - a. one of the 100+ substances that cannot be chemically broken down into simpler substances
  - b. a complete tag including the opening tag, enclosed tag content, and the closing tag
- 19. Engagement
  - a. a formal agreement to get married
  - b. an assessment of an individual's response to some type of offering, such as a product, a service or a website
- 20. Fiber
  - a. a thread that is used to form textile/cloth (example cotton)
  - b. an optic cable that transmit data
- 21. Finger
  - a. each of the five slender jointed parts attached to either hand
  - b. a networking tool that enables a user to view another user's basic information when using the same computer system or logged on in the same network
- 22. Firehose
  - a. a large-diameter hose used in extinguishing fires
  - b. a very large stream of data
- 23. Fishing/Phishing
  - a. the activity of catching fish
  - b. the fraudulent practice of sending emails purporting to be from reputable companies in order to induce individuals to reveal personal information, such as passwords and credit card numbers
- 24. Follow
  - a. to move or travel behind someone or something
  - b. to subscribe to someone's social media updates
- 25. Footprint
  - a. a track or mark left by a foot or show
  - b. a unique set of characteristics, actions, etc., that leave a trace and serve as a means of identification
- 26. Friend
  - a. one attached to another by affection or esteem
  - b. to add a person to one's list of contact on a social network
- 27. Handle
  - a. the part by which a thing is held, carried, or controlled
  - b. a username people have chat rooms, web forums, and social media services
- 28. Host
  - a. a person who receives or entertains other people as guests
  - b. computer or other device connected to a computer network
- 29. Java
  - a. slang for coffee
  - b. programming language that produces software for multiple platforms

- 30. Icon
  - a. a person who is idolized
  - b. a graphic symbol on a computer display screen that represents an app or an object (such as a file)

# 31. Kernel

- a. a softer, usually edible part of a nut, seed, or fruit stone contained within its hard shell
- b. foundational layer of an operating system
- 32. Like
  - a. to be suitable or agreeable to
  - b. to indicate one's enjoyment of, agreement with, or interest in website content, especially in social media
- 33. Memory
  - a. when the mind stores and remembers information
  - b. internal storage areas in the computer system
- 34. Menu
  - a. a list of food choices available in a restaurant
  - b. a set of options presented to the user of a computer application to help the user find information or execute a program function
- 35. Monitor
  - a. to observe and check the progress or quality of something over a period of time
  - b. a display screen used to provide visual output from a computer
- 36. Mouse
  - a. a small rodent that typically has a pointed snout, relatively large ears and eyes, and a long tail
  - b. a small handheld input device that controls a computer screen's cursor or pointer in conjunction with the way it is moved on a flat surface

#### 37. Net

- a. an open-meshed fabric twisted, knotted, or woven together at regular intervals
- b. a shortened version of the word internet
- 38. Ping
  - a. a short, high-pitched ringing sound.
  - b. a utility that is commonly used to check for network errors
- 39. Post
  - a. a long, sturdy piece of timber or metal set upright in the ground and used to support something
  - b. to share something on a social media
- 40. Profile
  - a. an outline of something, especially a person's face, as seen from one side
  - b. a short article giving a description of a person or organization
- 41. Pull
  - a. exert force on someone or something so as to cause movement toward oneself
  - b. a style of network communication where the initial request for data originates from the client and then is responded to by the server

# 42. Push

- a. to exert force on someone or something in order to move them away from oneself or the origin of the force
- b. an internet communication system in which the transaction request is generated by the central web server or publisher
- 43. Ram
  - a. a male sheep
  - b. a type of computer memory that can be accessed randomly
- 44. Reach
  - a. stretch out an arm in a specified direction in order to touch or grasp something
  - b. how many different people visit a Web site to see an ad

#### 45. Run

- a. to move at a speed faster than a walk, never having both or all the feet on the ground at the same time
- b. the action of starting or a computer program or application

# 46. Sandbox

- a. a shallow box or hollow in the ground partly filled with sand for children to play in
- b. a software management strategy that isolates applications from critical system resources and other programs

## 47. Script

- a. the written text of a play, movie, or broadcast
- b. the list of commands that are executed by a certain program or scripting engine

#### 48. Scroll

- a. a roll of parchment or paper for writing or painting on
- b. to move displayed text or graphics in a particular direction on a computer screen in order to view different parts of them

#### 49. Server

- a. a person or thing that provides a service or commodity
- b. a computer or computer program which manages access to a centralized resource or service in a network

## 50. Snap

- a. a sudden, sharp cracking sound made by moving two fingers against each other
- b. when you take a photo/video or receive a photo/video through Snapchat

#### 51. Spam

- a. a brand of canned cooked meat made by Hormel Foods Corporation
- b. electronic junk mail or junk newsgroup postings

# 52. Spider

- a. a small arachnid with a head, abdomen, and 8 legs
- b. a program that visits websites and reads their pages and other information in order to create entries for a search engine index
- 53. Stream
  - a. A small, narrow body of water
  - b. video or audio content sent in compressed form over the Internet and played immediately

# 54. Surf

- a. stand or lie on a surfboard and ride on a wave toward the shore
- b. the act of browsing the Internet by going from one web page to another web page using hyperlinks in an Internet browser

# 55. Swipe

- a. to steal something
- b. a command used primarily with touchscreen devices, such as smartphones and tablets that involves quickly moving a finger across a touchscreen or trackpad

#### 56. Tablet

- a. a flat slab of stone, clay, or wood, used especially for an inscription
- b. a portable computer that uses a touchscreen as its primary input device

# 57. Tag

- a. a label attached to something for the purpose of identification
- b. keyword or term assigned to a piece of information

## 58. Text

- a. the main body of a book or other piece of writing
- b. a message sent through short message service (SMS)

#### 59. Thread

- a. a long strand of combined fibers used for sewing
- b. feature used by many email clients, bulletin boards, newsgroups, and Internet forums in which the software aids the user by visually grouping messages with their replies

- 60. Timeline
  - a. a table listing important events for successive years within a particular historical period.
  - b. a collection of online posts or updates associated with a specific social-media account, in reverse chronological order
- 61. Traffic
  - a. vehicles moving on a road or public highway
  - b. messages or signals transmitted through a communications system.
- 62. Trojan Horse
  - a. a huge wooden horse the Greeks hid in to capture the city of Troy
  - b. malware that is often disguised as legitimate software; employed by cyber-thieves trying to gain access to users' systems
- 63. Troll
  - a. a mythical, cave-dwelling being depicted in folklore
  - b. a person who spies on others on the Internet
- 64. Tweet
  - a. the sound a bird makes
  - b. a post on the social media site Twitter
- 65. Unplug
  - a. to disconnect an electrical device by removing its plug from a socket
  - b. when a person disconnects from technology (sometimes referred to as a digital detox)
- 66. Vector
  - a. a quantity having direction as well as magnitude, especially as determining the position of one point in space relative to another
  - b. a logical element in programming languages that are used for storing data storing data
- 67. Virus
  - a. small infectious agent that replicates only inside the living cells of other organisms
  - b. malicious software that replicates itself by modifying other computer programs and inserting its own code
- 68. Wallpaper
  - a. paper that is pasted in vertical strips over the walls of a room to provide a decorative or textured surface
  - b. a digital image that is a decorative background on the screen of a computer
- 69. Web
  - a. silken structure created by a spider
  - b. internet-based hypertext system
- 70. Worm
  - a. a burrowing invertebrate animals with long, slender soft body and no limbs
  - b. standalone malware computer program that replicates itself in order to spread to other computers
